How Do I Know If I Need To Attend Waste Training?

Waste Management/Spill Response Training is a mandatory <u>annual</u> requirement for all Center personnel (civil servants and contractors) that: use, handle or request disposal of hazardous materials, oils, or hazardous waste.

The following list of activities would require you to attend training:

- Using a soldering kit
- · Adding oil to a machine
- Using an aerosol can
- Using solvent rags to clean parts
- Changing oily spill pads or drip pans
- Spraying pesticides
- Changing automotive fluids

- Using epoxies, resins, or adhesives
- Requesting oil or hazardous waste removal
- Using lubricants or greases
- Changing fluorescent light blubs
- Using lubricants or greases
- Working with lab chemicals













Of course, this isn't the full list. These are just some common examples that are often overlooked. If any of these apply to you, be sure you attend the mandatory annual Waste Management/Spill Response Training.
