## Nature Turkey Vulture

**LATIN NAME: Cathartes aura** 

**CLASS: Aves** 

**CONSERVATION STATUS: Least** Concern

**Turkey Vultures** get their name because their bald red heads from a distance resemble a turkey!

They can travel up to 200 miles a day.

They are often mistakenly called buzzards, which is a British word for certain hawks.

> **Turkey Vultures** the only scaven bird that can't kill their prey because their feet are cannot rip into prey.



They average 2 ½ feet tall and have a 6foot wingspan, but only weigh 3 lbs

> **Turkey Vultures** have the largest olfactory (smelling) system of any bird.

Their average lifespan is 20 years!

They have powerful beaks that can tear hrough even the toughest cow hide.

Turkey vultures prefer their meat as fresh as possible and won't eat extremely rotted meat. They can smell only 12-24-hour old dead meat. They also help to clean up the environment by eating the flesh of dead animals before it rots and causes disease.

**Turkey Vultures** live in most of the United States, Southern Canada, and Mexico



They lack vocal cords, so they make a low, guttural hiss. In flight, they make a nasally whining noise.



Turkey Vultures will eat pumpkins, Juniper berries, coconuts, and dead animals such as birds, reptiles, amphibians, and invertebrates.
